

Terms & Conditions for Events/Functions at Little Stream

- For all functions held on the premises . Payments are made in advance.
- Each additional person not originally on the guest booking list will be charged.
- Little Stream serves the right to refuse entry or service to persons that are unreasonably rowdy, under the influence or disruptive to others.
- Access to your booked area will be available from 10:00 to 13:00 or 14:00 17:00 at which time the area must be vacated.
- Last orders from the Tea garden are 16:30.
- No deck chairs or multi-colour umbrellas or multi-colour blankets.
- No open fires or braai (barbeque) are allowed on the property.
- If specific timings for set up are required, the management must be informed of these in advance.
- Do Not litter.
- Beware of pathways being slippery when wet, falling branches or trees whilst walking in the gardens
- Beware of the occasional baboon that may roam around the property – we are in a baboon protected zone.
- Little Stream estate accepts no responsibility for the loss or damage of any personal items.
- All items are left entirely at the owner's risk.
- Garden tap water NOT safe for drinking
- Children make not swim or wade in the stream.
- Children must be under the supervision of parents at all times.
- All dogs must be leashed at all times. Dog poop must be picked up by the owner.
- 15% service fee will be charged on the final bill.
- All prices quoted include VAT.
- All outstanding balances must be settled, in full, at the end of the day.
